DARING—Shirley was bold and courageous.

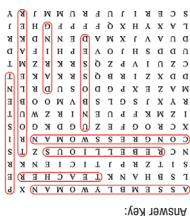
PERSISTENT—Shirley kept trying, even when things got hard.

TEACHER—Shirley taught kids just like you!

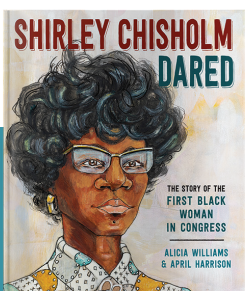
TROUBLEMAKER—Shirley encouraged other people to stand up to those in charge.
